**The Kinsey Factor:** According to Dr. Judith Reisman, the publishing of the Kinsey Reports was a turning point in history which opened the door to sexual immorality in America. The Kinsey Reports were based on fraudulent data submitted by rapists, pedophiles, and prison inmates who systematically molested and raped hundreds of children for "scientific" information. They recorded their "experiments" with a ledger and a stopwatch.

The information compiled in the Kinsey Reports sought to change our opinions about sexuality and to convince the public that we are sexual from birth. Ultimately, our perspective on our sexuality did change, which ignited the sexual revolution. Over time, penalties for sexual crimes were lessened and pornography and abortion were legalized. America now stands as the number one exporter of pornography to the rest of the world.

<b>The Noose of Bondage:</b> Understanding the noose of bondage is key to your freedom. The noose is composed of:
<ol> <li>The root: Wounds</li> <li>The mindset: Having a shame perspective of oneself</li> <li>The Lifestyle: Binge-purge cycle</li> <li>The cloak: Denial, delusion, and blame</li> </ol> The importance of processing the wound: King David was referred to as a "HaKatan", a worthless one, by his father. This sense of worthlessness worked its way down into David's soul. Like David, many successful men become entangled in sexual sin because they have failed to process their wounds. The majority of sex addicts in church come from rigid, disengaged religious homes dominated by rules and lacking in relationship. It is important to discover the root—the wounds in our
lives—in order to find true healing and freedom. The place where you were wounded is where the enemy has inserted a lie about you. However, sexual addiction isn't always caused by wounds, as there are men who become addicted simply by watching pornography; once they are hooked, they learn to deal with life by resorting to pornography, sex, and masturbation, to name a few. Sexually acting out becomes a coping mechanism. The majority of men trapped in sexual bondage have wounds from their past.
